CARUSIA, A NEW NAME FOR THE LATE CRETACEOUS LIZARD CAROLINA BORSUK-BIAŁYNICKA, 1985

BORSUK-BIAŁYNICKA, M.: Carusia, a new name for the Late Cretaceous lizard Carolina Borsuk-Białynicka, 1985. Acta Palaeont. Polonica, 32, 1—2, 151, 1987.

The name Carolina was assigned to a lizard from the Late Cretaceous of the Gobi Desert, Mongolia (Borsuk-Białynicka 1985). Subsequently, Dr. R. Schallreuter from Hamburg University has kindly informed me that Carolina was assigned previously as a generic name in two cases. One of the suggested homonyms Carolina Thomson, 1880, introduced for a scarabeid genus (Coleoptera) proved to be valid. I therefore, suggest the name Carusia to replace Carolina Borsuk-Białynicka, 1985. The etymology of the new name is similar to that of the old one. Carolina is the name of my daughter, Carusia is a diminuative of the same. According to ICZN Art. 39 the family name Carolinidae, for which Carolina was the type, should be changed into Carusiidae.
